What is Medical Negligence?

- A failure by doctor, hospital or healthcare provider to meet accepted standards of care.
- Must result in harm, injury or permanent disability to be legally actionable.
- Examples include:
 - Misdiagnosis or delayed diagnosis.
 - Surgical or anesthesia errors
 - Wrong medication or dosage.
 - Negligence during childbirth
 - Lack of proper post-operative care

Legal rights in India

- **Consumer Protection Act 2019**
 - File a complaint for “deficiency in service” in consumer courts.
 - 1. Consumer court
For compensation due to poor medical service. Quicker process.
 - 2. Civil Court
To claim monetary damages for long -term impact.
 - 3. Criminal Court
For gross negligence causing death or permanent disability.
- **Indian Penal Code (IPC)/ Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhitha (BNS)**
Sections 304A, 337, 338 - apply if negligence causes serious injury or death.
- **National Medical Councils/ State Medical Councils**
File complaints for professional misconduct.

Steps to build your case

1. Collect medical records.
Prescriptions, test results, bills, discharge summaries.
2. Get a medicolegal expert opinion.
independent doctor confirms the negligence and its impact.
3. Gather witness statements.
Family members or hospital staff who witnessed the events.
4. Request CCTV footage or internal reports (if available).
5. Document emotional and financial impact.
lost income, mental distress, future medical needs.

Compensation you can claim

- Medical Expenses- Current and future treatments, devices, therapy.
- Loss of Income- Present and potential future earnings.
- Pain and suffering- Physical and mental trauma.
- Rehabilitation and caregiver costs- long term support needs.
- Punitive Damages- In extreme cases of gross negligence



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Challenges to prepare for

- Hospitals may deny fault
- Keep communication in writing, insist on full records
- Legal process may be slow
- Consumer courts are generally faster than civil courts
- Lack of awareness or fear of retaliation
- Seek help from legal aid services or support groups.

Why legal and Medicolegal experts matter

- Lawyers help navigate the legal system, file correctly, and argue your case.
- Medicolegal experts provide critical testimony to prove negligence.
- Both are essentially to increase your chances of winning compensation.
